1.8.2 Project Brew Sponsorship - Dipal Patel

NCSAC has been approached by the Project Brew Sponsorship Team in the hopes of securing a sponsorship from NCSAC. Project Brew is hosted by the Niagara College Teaching Brewery students. NCSAC has a budget line "Community Sponsorships/Donation" for events like this. This sponsorship is a unique way to represent and support the NCSAC student membership.

1.8.3 Vending Machine Approval - Steve Kosh

Last January the Board tasked Steve to investigate vending machines to battle 'period poverty' on campus. One month ago, Steve was able to source two refurbished vending machines (1 per campus) for \$13,500. Steve explained to the Board that although this decision should have come to the Board for approval, the timeline was very tight and NCSAC needed act fast in order to secure the vending machines in order to have them ready to go for September. Dipal is currently working with different suppliers to select items for the vending machines. It was noted that these vending machines will provide feminine hygiene products for free in order to combat period poverty. Eventually, it's possible that other products are available in the vending machine, for example: condoms, deodorant, etc.

1.8.4 The Core Painting - Steve Kosh

The Core at the Welland Campus has needed a refresh for a while. Since it was renovated years ago, the space had been looking pretty tired and had a lot of dents and scratches on the walls. NCSAC gives \$25,000 to the college to hold in trust to use for any Capital Improvements throughout; these funds are not taken from the NCSAC operating budget. These funds can be used on anything that NCSAC can't take with us (i.e. permanent structure to the building). Therefore, The Core painting was taken from this Capital Improvement budget. There will be new signage installed featuring the new NCSAC logo as well. This new space will be fresh and ready to welcome students in September.

1.8.5 U-Pass Update - Steve Kosh

In the U-Pass Referendum last year, there was a 33% voter turn-out, and 74% of those who voted, voted YES. NCSAC, along with the college have reached an agreement with Niagara Regional Transit to implement the U-Pass for September 2023.

Currently, NCSAC is working with the Region to identify what will be used as the pass. In the past, students received a sticker on their student card however with this system, there were

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	issues with fraudulent riders. When the buses were overrun with fraudulent riders, the cost	
	would increase for next year's students in order to accommodate more buses due to	
	overcrowding. Therefore, NCSAC and the region are looking to find a new infrastructure to	
	facilitate the U-Pass program in order to ensure only eligible NC students are riding. Steve	
	mentioned that using the technology in the NC student cards is not an option as there is no	
	more mag stripe on NC students cards and they only have one chip, and therefore they are not	
	compatible with the buses. As of right now, NCSAC and the Region are looking to use the	
	transit app. Students would need to make an account on the app , and then NC would need to	
	export a list to the Region every night from the college with eligible riders. Students who do not	
	have a smart phone would be given a monthly pass, and then manually removed from the	
	exported list.	
	Another issue that NCSAC is working through with the Region is variable charges. This new	
	amalgamated regional system is only 7 months old, and therefore there is going to be a lot of	
	growing pains. As of right now, every month the Regional calculates ridership, and NCSAC	
	pays. However, NCSAC wants to push that only riders pay this would mean that there would be	
	a list of 'active accounts' and only those students would be charged.

	The final agreement between NCSAC and the Niagara Regional Transit will be sent over to the	
	Niagara College legal team for review.	
	1.8.6 Director Onboarding – Dipal Patel/Heather Storey	
	It was explained that Heather will be sending out the sign in information for the Director's	
	NCSAC-specific e-mails in the next day or so. It was highlighted that moving forward, NCSAC	
	will be exclusively using the Director e-mails for all professional communication. Additionally, it	
	was explained that NCSAC uses a governance portal called "Aprio"; the Board was told that	
	they will be expected to complete a training module to familiarize themselves with the platform.	
	1.8.7 August Retreat – Dipal Patel	
	Dipal announced to the Board that the August Retreat will take place on Thursday, August 24,	
	2023 – Friday, August 25, 2023. This retreat is mandatory and will be in-person at each campus.
