## SAC 17.6

#### **Board Decisions**

17.6.1. Strategic Plan Approval – Tom Price

After months of hard work, NCSAC is in the final stages of developing the NCSAC Strategic Plan. After receiving feedback from the college executive team, as well as recommendations from the Directors at the workshop held last week, the Strategic Priorities has been finalized. Tom noted the importance of liaison with the college team, however this Strategic Plan was truly developed by student-leaders of the NCSAC organization.

Tom presented the final version of the Strategic Priorities:

#### **NCSAC Strategic Priorities**

- Supporting the Well-being of Students
  - Through activities, actions, and services, NCSAC will ensure that the overall health of all our students is at the forefront of what we do
  - Provide social programs and event that support an enhanced student school-life balance
  - Enhance food security through NCSAC led activities in partnership with other on-campus resources
  - Collaborate with college and community stakeholders to provide students with the opportunity to develop healthy relationships through the promotion of programs and services to reduce the risk of sexual violence.
- Creating an Environment for Student Success
  - Strive to ease financial challenges that restrict students from successfully completing their education through effective operations and the facilitation of employment opportunities within NCSAC
  - Collaborate with college and community stakeholders to eliminate barriers for students requiring accommodation in the pursuit of their educational goals
  - Increase student access to campus through the removal of transportation barriers
- Representing student interests
  - Advocate for student rights with community stakeholders and all levels of government
  - Create opportunities for the development of student leaders to strengthen NCSAC as an organization
  - Promote welcoming, supportive and positive relationships with the college community through open communication and active engagement

Tom also mentioned that there are two consultation meetings scheduled for next week with Dr. David Veres and himself with several Associate Deans, Deans, Directors and Managers of the college to review these strategic priorities and to discuss how to best work together to achieve these strategic priorities.

17.6.2. Indigenous Women in Sports Leadership Event – Tom Price

Tom was approached by the Niagara Chapter – Native Women Inc. to become a sponsor for their inaugural event, "Blockers & Attackers: Indigenous Women in Sports Leadership". The event will take place on Saturday, September 19, 2020. Tom informed the Board that he would be reallocating \$250 from the Presidents Expense Account to support the Niagara Chapter - Native Women Inc. (NCNW) inaugural Blockers & Attackers: Indigenous Women in Sports Leadership event as a Moccasins Sponsor.

17.6.3. Community Foundations of Canada Emergency Community Support Fund – Nourishing Minds Funds – Tom Price

NCSAC has been working closely with Alumni relations over the last few months in regards to funding the Nourishing Minds virtual grocery gift card program. This past March/early April, Alumni Relations reallocated \$50,000 to NCSAC to support the Nourishing Minds program. After that donation, Niagara College reallocated a total of \$150,000 to support the program. In addition, after the Seafood Gala was cancelled due to COVID-19, Alumni Relations offered some of the ticket sales to be reallocated, which resulted in NCSAC receiving more monetary donations for Nourishing Minds. More recently, Ellen Schonewille, who works in the Alumni Relations department, applied for a grant through the Emergency Community Support Fund. Ellen received confirmation that the Nourishing Minds Program at Niagara College was indeed eligible and NCSAC was the recipient of an additional \$50,000 to continue to support the program to help aid students struggling with food security. Tom is continuing to reach out to different partners in the community to educate who NCSAC is, what NCSAC does, different supports and services NCSAC offers, in the hopes of receiving additional funding.

17.6.4. Campus Screening Survey – Tom Price

Tom and Steve were approached by the Niagara College IT department for assistance in gaining a student perspective in regards to a survey that will be used to screen people once the campus reopens. The IT department wants to ensure that students are comfortable and understand the questions on the survey to ensure the safety of everyone. Once the IT department makes the link available to screen the questions, Tom will circulate the link.
